

## **STAPLEHURST PARISH COUNCIL NOTES (for August 2008)**

**PLAYSCHEME 2008** – Playscheme is running for three weeks 4-22<sup>nd</sup> August weekday mornings (for 4-11 year olds). Application forms are available to download from the website at [www.staplehurstvillage.org.uk](http://www.staplehurstvillage.org.uk) or can be emailed to you, just ask; [assistantclerk@staplehurstvillage.org.uk](mailto:assistantclerk@staplehurstvillage.org.uk). Subject to availability, advance bookings with completed application forms and payment can be made at the Parish Office at £3 per day or £5 at the door. Details of special events and visitors in addition to the usual crafts, painting and sporty activities are given on the website or available from the Parish Office.

**CHARLTON COMMUNITY FOOTBALL SCHEME** – The three parishes of Marden, Headcorn and Staplehurst have each contributed towards a community football scheme to be run by Charlton Athletic Football Club during this year. Weekly sessions have been held in each of the three parishes on a rotating basis and the scheme returns to Staplehurst Primary School from 15<sup>th</sup> July – 12<sup>th</sup> August. **JUBILEE SPORTS CHANGING FACILITY** – By the time you read this, it is hoped that the tendering process will be taking place and a contractor soon appointed to begin building the long awaited sports changing facility and improvements to the car park at Jubilee Sports Field. This project has been made possible through the hard work and diligence with the grant application process by Staplehurst Football Clubs in partnership with the Parish Council. The combined financial backing of the Football Foundation, KCC, MBC, Parish Council, Football Clubs and the Guides has ensured this project will soon become a reality.

**REPORTING ONLINE** - The internet is a very useful tool to find out local information and also to feedback faults for repair. The Parish Council has had a website for many years as well as a Village Forum for anyone to contribute their views or find local information. On the Maidstone Borough Council Website, planning applications can be viewed online and any problems or defects in the parish can be reported at [www.maidstone.gov.uk](http://www.maidstone.gov.uk). Kent County Council website also encourages the reporting of highway items requiring attention or repair on [www.kent.gov.uk/highways](http://www.kent.gov.uk/highways). You can even comment on services or answer surveys via these websites too.

**Kent Highways** - Call 08458 247 800 any time 24 hours a day 7 days a week to report any local highways issues, such as defects to the roads, footways,

signs, drainage and street furniture, etc. You can also report defects online too at [www.kent.gov.uk/highways](http://www.kent.gov.uk/highways) Responsibility for the motorways and trunk roads are managed by the Highways Agency on 08457 504030. **Maidstone Borough Highway-related services** - MBC remains responsible for some highway services such as Street sweeping, street nameplates, street naming and numbering, park and ride facilities, concessionary fares and public transport matters. MBC Contact Centre to report most issues requiring attention is 01622 602162.

**Report it!** PC Marc Pennicott with Community Warden, Chris Lomax and Special Constable Ken Baker have now been joined by PCSO Pete Gardner. These officers are the local visible policing presence in our Parish, but have emergency back up from the force as necessary. If you witness anti-social behaviour contact the Parish Warden, Chris Lomax on 07811 271254, PCSO Pete Gardner on 07772 226134 or PC Marc Pennicott on 07980 770575. However, these are not 24/7 contact numbers so do leave a message and they will get back to you when next on duty. All urgent calls for assistance should be directed to 999 with crime-incident reporting to Maidstone Police Station on 01622 690055.

Unless reports of anti-social incidents with descriptions of the offenders are made, then the desecration of our public areas or property will continue with impunity. Report incident details on 01622 690055 and provide the PACT panel with the opportunity to think up ways of dealing with it! If you prefer, calls to Crimestoppers are free and anonymous: 0800 555 111 but these may not be referred back directly to this parish. Life-threatening incidents, crimes in progress or serious injury Road Traffic Accident requiring urgent police attendance should be notified by dialling 999 in the usual way.

**Dog Mess & disposal** - Thankfully only a small minority allow their dogs to defecate in public areas without clearing up the mess. If you witness such anti-social behaviour, telephone 01622 602117 in confidence and give the Dog Warden details of the perpetrators. Visits to problem areas can be timed to be most effective and fines imposed when the offenders are caught. RED DOG WASTE BINS are for the disposal of dog waste only and emptied by a specialist contractor with protective equipment for this messy job. The red Scoopit Bags have been out of stock for some months now although it is hoped fresh supplies will be available soon from the Parish Office or the Town Hall in Maidstone.

**Bogus Caller Advice:** This time of year always shows an increase in Bogus callers and Rogue Traders, the most popular one is a water board official. If the caller does not have an appointment, then ask them to wait while you check their identity, if you do need to have a closer look at it, do not be afraid to close the door and make them wait. Checking identity can sometimes be difficult and

confusing to do. If so, ask them to come back at another time when you can have someone with you. If the caller is genuine they will understand and not mind returning.

Neighbourhood Watch operates a scheme called Nominated Neighbour, which asks the caller to go to a neighbour who will return with them, so you do not have to deal with this alone. If you wish to learn any more about this, contact the Neighbourhood Watch Office on 01622 604395. Never give any personal details to a stranger. Remember it is your home and you should not be afraid to ask them to leave. If you are at all concerned about a caller, call Mid Kent Police on 01622 690055.

**Handyvan & Homesafe Services:** These services are financially supported by KCC and provide security services to households across Kent. Services are generally provided free of charge, although in some cases a small charge will be made. The Handyvan Service is delivered in partnership with Help the Aged and is primarily aimed at the over 60's, on low incomes and where no charges are made for labour or materials. The Homesafe service offer free security fitting for victims of burglary or household crime. The range of products include: Security Locks; Carbon Monoxide Detectors and Smoke Alarms. **Rubbish Dumping Tip-Off Line - 01622 602162** - Use this number to report any undesirable activities such as fly-tipping, dumped cars, littering etc. and help to keep this borough and parish as clean and tidy as possible. The same number can also be used to request a "pull-out" (or rear of property) collection service for those who are unable to wheel or carry their refuse to the front boundary of their homes. **Garden waste & Newspaper recycling** - MBC Green Garden Sacks are available from Spuds 'n Buds, Henhurst Farm Shop or the Parish Office at £2.25 per roll of 5. Garden waste will only be collected if in the MBC printed green sacks and left beside your wheeled bin (or put in a blue-lidded wheelie bin hired from MBC specifically for garden waste). For residents who have a black box; newspapers will be collected fortnightly from the boundary of your home as advised by Maidstone Borough Council. Please check with MBC the collection dates for your road by telephoning: 01622 602162 or look on the MBC website.

**MBC Bulky Collection Service** - Residents with large items of household waste to dispose of, should telephone the MBC Cleansing Hotline 01622 602162 to arrange a collection. A small charge is now made for this service. Alternatively the Tovil tip and waste freighter are available for householder's

use. Please note that due to new legislation TVs and monitors will now be collected separately from any other items of waste. You will be required to provide your name and address at disposal.

**MBC Waste Freighter** – This service for householder's non-recyclable waste will visit Staplehurst three times in August! **Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> August 0900-1000 at Poyntell Road near the pond, Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> August 1415-1515 at Northdown near the junction with Marden Road and on Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> August 1630-1715 at Church Green.**
